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# Singapore Dance Theatre presents the 19<sup>th</sup> Edition of Ballet Under the Stars

18 – 20 July & 25 – 27 July 2014 Fort Canning Green



Immerse yourself in the perfect evening at Singapore Dance Theatre's (SDT) 19<sup>th</sup> Edition of the annual Ballet Under the Stars. This year, SDT will be presenting two weekends of exquisite choreography by award-winning international choreographers from 18 – 20 July and 25 – 27 July at Fort Canning Green.

Expect spectacular works in the likes of George Balanchine's joyous *Allegro Brillante* and the grand masterpiece, *Theme and Variations*, Val Caniparoli's Asian-inspired *Chant*, Edwaard Liang's *The Winds of Zephyrus* and *Opus* 25, Edmund Stripe's breath-taking *Piano Concerto No. 2, Opus 102*, and a world premiere by internationally acclaimed Australian contemporary choreographer Natalie Weir.

SDT Artistic Director Janek Schergen comments, "For Singapore Dance Theatre, Ballet Under the Stars remains an iconic, signature event in our annual performance calendar. Now, with two consecutive weekends of performances, we can offer a more diverse range of repertoire to our audiences. Certain pieces lend themselves better in an outdoor setting and this year's choice of seven ballets comprises the finest of both our classical and contemporary repertoire. Of special interest will be a new pas de deux created by Natalie Weir, especially for the park performances. Our audience will remember her from last year's haunting *4Seasons* and 2012's performances of *Jabula*. Ballet Under the Stars is a time stamp – it is one of those events that lasts in memory long beyond the experience itself!"

Since its conception in 1995, Ballet Under the Stars has become one of SDT's trademarks of our yearly performance seasons and remains as Singapore's favourite annual outdoor dance event. Unwind with a sumptuous picnic spread at the park and enjoy an evening of dance together with your family and friends!

# Performance Line up 18 – 20 July

#### Piano Concerto No. 2, Opus 102 by Edmund Stripe

Piano Concerto in F Major (music composed by Dimitri Shoskatovitch) by Edmund Stripe, is a 20-minute piece that features 7 female and 6 male dancers on stage in a fast-paced and exciting work. Audiences will probably find the music of the first movement of this choreography familiar as it was featured in the Disney movie, Fantasia 2000. This ballet was created for SDT and premiered in 2007 at Ballet Under the Stars.

#### **Bittersweet** by Natalie Weir (World Premiere)

Bittersweet is a pas de deux created by Natalie Weir for SDT. The pas de deux will be danced by two different couples for each weekend of Ballet Under the Stars. Natalie Weir is an established and acclaimed choreographer, known for her highly physical partner work, her organic movement style and her touching insight into human nature. Natalie Weir has created over 150 professional works in her 20+ year career. She was a founding member of Expressions Dance Company (EDC) and has worked extensively throughout Australia, creating many works for most of the country's major classical and contemporary dance companies including the Australian Ballet, West Australian Ballet, Queensland Ballet, Expressions Dance Company, Australian Dance Theatre, Dance North and Tasdance.

#### Chant by Val Caniparoli

Created especially for SDT in 2012, *Chant* is an Asian-inspired work featuring thirteen dancers, performed to Lou Harrison's Double Concerto for Violin and Cello with Javanese Gamelan. In the movement Caniparoli created, one will eventually see a repetitive movement motif that corresponds to a way a chant is repeated over and over to create a sense of harmony and purpose. Val Caniparoli is one of the most sought after American choreographers in the United States and abroad and has created ballets for more than 35 companies including Pacific Northwest Ballet, Boston Ballet, Northern Ballet Theatre, Pennsylvania Ballet, Royal Winnipeg Ballet, Ballet West, Washington Ballet, Singapore Dance Theatre and Tulsa Ballet.

#### The Winds of Zephyrus by Edwaard Liang

First created for SDT in 2011, *The Winds of Zephyrus* brings contemporary dance to stratospheric heights with dancers portraying the wind in all its forms. Winner of the Prince Prize Grant for Choreography and the Choo San Goh Award for Choreography, Edwaard Liang's pieces have been performed all around the world by companies such as New York City Ballet, San Francisco Ballet, Shanghai Ballet and the Joffrey Ballet. Edwaard Liang is currently the Artistic Director of BalletMet Columbus.

# Allegro Brillante by George Balanchine

Choreographed in 1956, *Allegro Brillante* by George Balanchine demonstrates the dramatic possibilities inherent in pure dance when coupled with the Russian romanticism of Tchaikovsky's score. The music's vigorous pace makes the steps appear even more difficult, but the ballet relies on strong dancing, precise timing, and breadth of gesture. Balanchine once said of the ballet, "It contains everything I know about the classical ballet in 13 minutes."

#### Bittersweet by Natalie Weir

A world premiere by Natalie Weir, also performed at Ballet Under the Stars from 18 – 20 July.

## Theme and Variations by George Balanchine

The legendary George Balanchine's *Theme and Variations*, a company premiere, is a grand masterpiece of ballet. This breath-taking ballet showcases the intensive development of the classic ballet lexicon, featuring a cast of 26 dancers. Performed to Tchaikovsky's brilliant score, "the moment" for the ballet is found in the grand polonaise which exudes drama and excitement. This ballet is a crowd pleaser, offering the audience any number of favourite moments, with dazzling choreography, gorgeous music, spectacular costumes and the remarkable culmination of all these elements on stage in performance.

#### Opus 25 by Edwaard Liang

*Opus 25* is a specially commissioned work for SDT's 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 2013, choreographed to showcase the talents of SDT. Danced to a dynamic composition by American composer Michael Torke, this piece showcases the development of the organisation over the past 26 years. The ballet is a grand spectacle, featuring 32 dancers, and brings out the unique attributes and personalities of the dancers in SDT.

## THE COMPANY

SDT was founded in 1988 by Goh Soo Khim and Anthony Then. Since then, SDT has developed into Singapore's premier professional dance company comprising 37 dancers. In the course of each year, the Company performs six main seasons, including the widely popular *Ballet Under The Stars* at the Fort Canning Park, two full length classics, *Masterpiece in Motion* which brings together three works of the finest international choreography and *Passages* Contemporary Season.

As an ambassador for dance and for Singapore, the company aims to be an internationally well-regarded professional dance company that is known for its unique ability to shine in classical, neo-classical and contemporary repertoire with works that are timeless and inspiring.

The Company's repertoire ranges from classical to contemporary ballet, from renowned choreographers like Goh Choo San, George Balanchine, Nacho Duato, Jiri Kylian, Stanton Welch, Marie-Claude Pietragalla, Xing Liang, Natalie Weir, Val Caniparoli, Graham Lustig, David Dawson, Jorma Elo, Edmund Stripe, Adrian Burnett, Edwaard Liang, Nils Christe, Toru Shimazaki and Christina Chan.

In 2008, Janek Schergen was appointed Artistic Director of SDT. Under his leadership, the Company has made new achievements in the international and Singapore dance arena. In the last six years, the Company has added 16 world premieres and 12 company premieres to the repertoire, in addition to numerous revivals of the existing Company's repertoire. Janek is also the Artistic Director of the Choo-San Goh & H. Robert Magee Foundation which oversees the licensing and production of Choo San Goh's ballets and the annual Choo San Goh Awards for Choreography.

SDT actively reaches out to the public to create greater awareness of dance through outreach to schools with its Arts Education Programme, Dance Appreciation Series (jointly presented with Esplanade Co.), Adults Dance Classes, Scholars Programme for students considering dancing as a career, *Passages* choreographic workshop focusing on local emerging talents and One @ The Ballet, an initiative to help the public gain a better understanding of the different aspects of dance.

In 2013, SDT moved to a new premise with four state of the art studios. Additionally the Company will be enhancing efforts in Education and Outreach, bringing greater awareness and appreciation for dance to a wider audience.
