Singapore Dance Theatre presents Ballet Under the Stars 5 – 7 & 12 – 14 July 2019 | Fort Canning Green

Ballet Under the Stars is back for its 24th edition! Established by Singapore Dance Theatre (SDT) in 1995 as Singapore's most loved and iconic outdoor dance event at the **Fort Canning Green**, we will be presenting a weekend of contemporary works from **5 – 7 July**, and another weekend of classical ballets from **12 – 14 July 2019**.

"Ballet Under the Stars has become such an annual tradition, after 24 years, that many people who have become acquainted with Singapore Dance Theatre see us first in the park performances. For this reason alone, it is imperative that we present the absolute best of our repertoire suitable to the environment of the park's performance situation.

Our first weekend brings to our audiences two works created for us, *Linea Adora* by Timothy Harbour and *Evening Voices* by Tim Rushton. Both are perfect examples of what the dancers of SDT inspire in the choreographic voices of remarkably talented and creative dance makers. It is what makes us unique as SDT. Complimenting this is *SYNC* by Nils Christe, from the 30th anniversary gala in 2018; this ballet is unlike any other piece in our repertoire.

Our second weekend is a celebration of absolute classical ballets. It begins with the haunting Act II of *Giselle*, followed by several divertissements from *Swan Lake*, including the famous White Swan pas de deux from Act II and Act III's Black Swan pas de deux. The end of the evening is Act II of *The Nutcracker*, called the "Land of the Sweets". In it, we have everything from the Dewdrop Fairy in the waltz of the flowers to the Sugar Plum Fairy and her cavalier in the grand pas de deux. These ballets are presented in their chronological order of creation and, in many ways, are an exploration of dance through the classical period that made ballet one of the greatest arts in the world. ." says Artistic Director Janek Schergen.

"Linea Adora translates from latin as 'the adoration of lines' or ' 'the glory of lines'. (For the latin aficionados please forgive my interpretation if it proves inadequate). Celebrating line, both in the individual shapes the dancers make and in the configurations of the ensemble, was a starting point for creating this work. Ballet's powerful form owes much to its use of line, and the sense it makes organising the human frame. Also, we had this wonderful music to work with. It's dramatic mood changes and graphic lyricism inspired the four distinct sections of the work. Lastly, Linea Adora is a reflection of the dancers of Singapore Dance Theatre. They all appear in it and I hope that their talents for dynamism, musicality and cohesion are all evident for you. '

SYNC

Originally created for the Washington Ballet, SYNC has been successfully performed by 14 companies in Europe, USA and Australia. Standing for "syncronisation", "syncopation" and "to be in sync", SYNC was created to Salgari by Italian composer Ludovico Einaudi. The music is partly very quick, percussive and propulsive, but also lyrical and poetic. The large truss gives a "high-tech" feeling to the piece. It is not only there as decoration, therefore adding an interesting element to the choreography.

Giselle Act II

The second act takes place on a moonlit night in a forest at Giselle's tomb. It is just before midnight and Hilarion has broken-heartedly laid Giselle to rest. Berthe, Giselle's mother, comes to bid her daughter a final farewell. She becomes too distressed and has to be led away. Hilarion too, remembering the legend of the Wilis, hurries away.

At midnight, Myrtha, the Queen of the Wilis appears with an entourage of Wilis. This is the night Giselle is to be initiated as one of them. Albrecht, laden with feelings of guilt and remorse visits Giselle's grave. He sees a vision of Giselle and follows it into the forest.

Meanwhile, Hilarion becomes the first prey of the Wilis, and is forced to dance until he eventually dies from exhaustion. The Wilis then discover Albrecht and try to inflict the same fate on him. He is saved by Giselle who still loves him deeply even after death. At the break of dawn, the Wilis lose their power and return to their graves. Albrecht is spared and it is at this point that he comes to realise that he has lost his true love.

A grand ball to celebrate Prince Siegfried's 21st birthday is taking place. Guests from far and wide come to give their well-wishes. Prince Siegfried is introduced to six royal princesses, expecting that he will choose one of them for his bride. Rothbart arrives at the ball with his daughter, Odile, the Black Swan, who has been magically disguised to resemble Odette. Prince Siegfried, mistaking Odile for Odette, is tricked into breaking his vow by declaring his undying devotion to Odile.

At the lakeside, Odette is reunited with Prince Siegfried and forgives him for his unwitting error. Rothbart arrives at the lake and engages Siegfried in a fight, during which Rothbart is killed. The spell placed on Odette and her swan maidens is broken and they will never change into swans again. Odette and Prince Siegfried live happily ever after.

THE COMPANY

SDT was founded in 1988 by Goh Soo Khim and Anthony Then. Since then, SDT has developed into Singapore's premiere professional dance company comprising of 34 dancers plus apprentices and trainees. In the course of each year, the Company performs six main seasons, including the widely popular Ballet Under the Stars at the Fort Canning Park, two full length classics, Masterpiece in Motion which brings together three works of the finest international choreography and Passages Contemporary Season.

The Company's repertoire ranges from 19th century traditional classical to contemporary works, from renowned choreographers like Choo-San Goh, George Balanchine, Stanton Welch, Natalie Weir, Val Caniparoli, Edmund Stripe, Kinsun Chan, Edwaard Liang, Nils Christe, Toru Shimazaki, Christina Chan, Ma Cong, Timothy Harbour and most recently, Timothy Rushton.

In 2008, Janek Schergen was appointed as the Artistic Director of SDT, after his extensive involvement with SDT since its inception years in 1988. Under his leadership, the Company has made new achievements in the international and Singapore dance arena. In the last ten years, the Company has added 30 world premieres and 19 company premieres and new productions to the repertoire, in addition to numerous revivals of the existing Company's repertoire. Janek is also the Artistic Director of the Choo-San Goh & H. Robert Magee Foundation which oversees the licensing and production of Choo San Goh's ballets and the annual Choo San Goh Awards for Choreography.

SDT has captivated audiences in Malaysia, Indonesia, Philippines, Cambodia, Hong Kong, Mexico, China, Australia, France, United States, London, Switzerland, Thailand and most recently Laos. The Company has taken part and has performed in numerous international festivals and events, such as Le Temps d'Aimer la Danse a Biarritz in France, Mexico's Festival Internacional Cervantino, Chang Mu Arts Festival in Korea, Philippines Festival of Dance, and was part of the Victorian Arts Centre's Made to Move subscription series. SDT tours Kuala Lumpur and Penang annually, and has seen a growth in its dedicated support to the company.

SDT actively reaches out to the public to create greater awareness of dance through outreach to schools with its Arts Education Programme, Dance Appreciation Series (jointly presented with Esplanade Co.), Adults Dance Classes, Scholars Programme for students considering dancing as a career, SDT Choreographic Workshop focusing on local emerging talents and One @ the Ballet, an initiative to help the public gain a better understanding of the different aspects of dance.

In 2013, SDT moved to a new premise with four state of the art studios. Since, the Company has enhanced efforts in Education and Outreach, bringing greater awareness and appreciation for dance to a wider audience. We also cater the Ballet Associate's Course (BAC) for students who intend to develop their dance skills and techniques. Last year, we introduced Adopt an Audience to make arts accessible for everyone, including the low-income, underprivileged, and disabled in our society.

In celebration of SDT's 30th Anniversary as well as for the Nation's birthday, SDT's ballet master, Mohamed Noor Sarman choreographed the dance music video for NDP 2018 theme song 'We are Singapore'.
